Reading and Writing: We use a variety of materials to teach the reading, writing, listening and speaking Common Core standards for Kindergarten. We follow the scope and sequence of Journeys, a Houghton Mifflin Harcourt reading series. We will also be using Secret Stories to help teach phonics. These resources along with read alouds, writing journals, word work, poetry lessons and small group reading instruction make up the core of our reading and writing programs.

- Math: Our math curriculum is Eureka math. We begin each lesson with an overview video and then move into a well designed lesson that integrates both hands-on, a visual representation of the concept presented on the Smart Board and pencil/paper activities to give students opportunities to explore and connect with math concepts in a variety of ways. Eureka math is a rigorous math curriculum that delves deep into the meaning of numbers and how they work together. You can find out more about Eureka math here: https://greatminds.org/math.
